

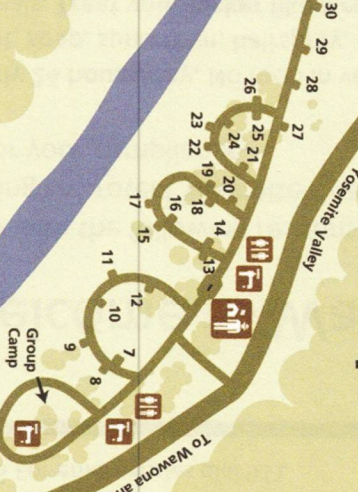
C Loop



B Loop

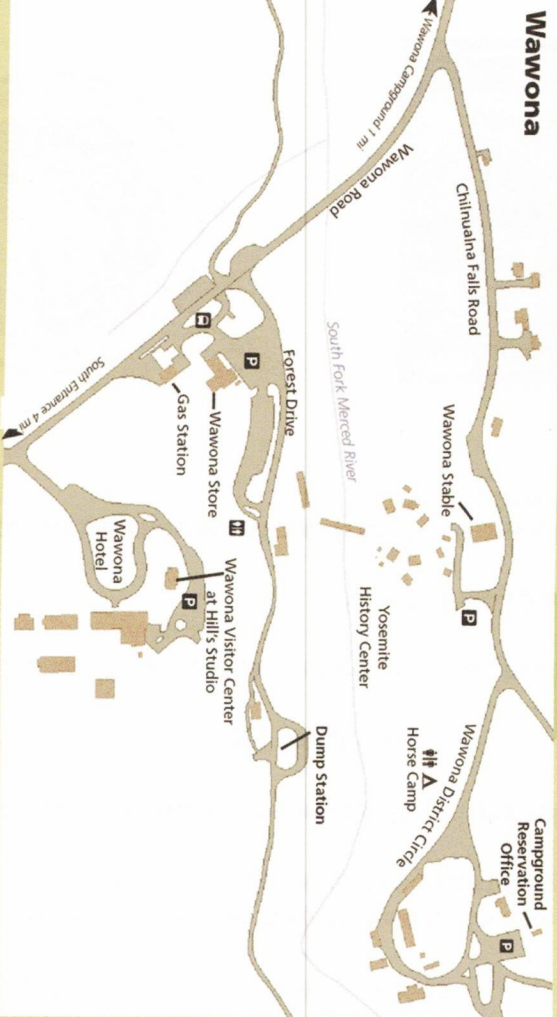

Welcome to Wawona Campground

Please read and comply with the following responsibilities to ensure a safe and pleasant stay for all. In doing so, you'll be helping to protect Yosemite's natural and cultural resources for future campers. We thank you in advance for your compliance.

Food must be stored properly 24 hours/day. No food in vehicles. All food, ice chests, grocery bags and anything with a scent (toothpaste, deodorant, soap, sunscreen, hairspray, etc.) must be stored in metal food storage lockers, except when preparing or eating meals. **Treat your locker like a refrigerator**--closed and latched when not in use. Hard-sided recreational vehicles may store food inside, provided it is not visible from the outside and all doors and windows are closed when unattended.

Dispose of trash regularly in dumpsters provided. Do not hang or burn trash in your site.

Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Generator use is permitted during the following periods: 7AM-9AM, 12PM-2PM, and 5PM-7PM. Please use them sparingly during these times.

Check out time is 12:00 noon on the day of departure. Please depart on time and leave a clean camp.

Campfires are permitted year-round in established grates. Fires must be attended to at all times and extinguished with water, so that coals are cold and no smoke is visible. Wood must fit inside the ring.

Wash dishes at your campsite. Camping wastewater, such as dishwater, must be disposed of in proper utility sinks at restrooms. No bathing or dishwashing at restrooms. Catch basins are needed for solar showers. Do not use any kind of soap, shampoo, or other detergent in or near any water source. Sanitary dump stations are in Wawona and Yosemite Valley. Obtain potable water for RVs at the dump station.

Two motorized vehicles maximum per site. All vehicles (motorized or not) must be parked on established parking pads designated for each site. Vehicles may not be driven off the roadways. Do not drive past or move rock barriers. Valid campground car passes must be displayed in all vehicle windshields.

Switching sites is not permitted. Camping is permitted in designated, assigned campsites only.

Six (6) people maximum per site, including children.

Pets must always be on a leash no longer than 6 feet and may not be left unattended and tied to an object. All pet excrement must be removed and disposed of in waste receptacles.

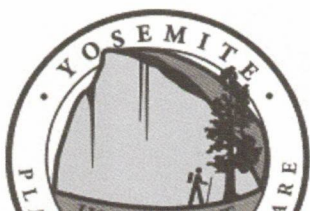
No digging, trenching, or leveling the ground. No driving nails, stakes, or other objects into the trees.

Dead or live trees or shrubs may not be cut down.

Collecting pinecones, rocks, flowers, artifacts, etc. is prohibited.

Speed Limit **10 mph** in campground
